



Senate, May 11, 1971. The Committee on Appropriations reported through Senator Houley of the 35th District, Chairman of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE COMPENSATION OF FINANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 4-93 of the general
2 statutes is repealed and the following is
3 substituted in lieu thereof: The finance advisory
4 committee shall consist of the governor, the
5 lieutenant governor, the treasurer, the
6 comptroller, two senate members of the committee
7 on appropriations appointed by the president pro
8 tempore of the senate, not more than one of whom
9 shall be of the same political party, and three
10 house members of the committee on appropriations
11 appointed by the speaker of the house, not more
12 than two of whom shall be of the same political
13 party. The president pro tempore of the senate
14 and the speaker of the house shall make their
15 respective appointments to the finance advisory
16 committee before the sixth Wednesday after the
17 convening of the general assembly IN THE ODD-
18 NUMBERED YEAR. The legislative members of said
19 committee shall serve until the sixth Wednesday
20 after the convening of the next regular session of
21 the general assembly IN THE ODD-NUMBERED YEAR and
22 shall be paid at the rate of [ten] TWENTY-FIVE

23 dollars per day for the time required in the
24 performance of their duties, and shall receive
25 travel allowance in the same amount as received by
26 them when attending sessions of the general
27 assembly. Said committee shall meet regularly on
28 the first Wednesday of each month and at such
29 other times as the governor designates.
30 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect from its
31 passage.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE COMPENSATION OF FINANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 4-93 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof: The finance advisory committee shall consist of the governor, the lieutenant governor, the treasurer, the comptroller, two senate members of the committee on appropriations appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate, not more than one of whom shall be of the same political party, and three house members of the committee on appropriations appointed by the speaker of the house, not more than two of whom shall be of the same political party. The president pro tempore of the senate and the speaker of the house shall make their respective appointments to the finance advisory committee before the sixth Wednesday after the convening of the general assembly IN THE ODD-NUMBERED YEAR. The legislative members of said committee shall serve until the sixth Wednesday after the convening of the next regular session of the general assembly IN THE ODD-NUMBERED YEAR and shall be paid at the rate of [ten] TWENTY-FIVE dollars per day for the time required in the performance of their duties, and shall receive travel allowance in the same amount as received by them when attending sessions of the general assembly. Said committee shall meet regularly on the first Wednesday of each month and at such other times as the governor designates.
