AN ACT CONCERNING TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT BY RETIRED TEACHERS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 10-183 of the 1969 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof: A retired member of the retirement association may substitute in any one school year or be employed temporarily as a teaching specialist or homebound instructor in a position subject to membership in the retirement association but shall receive no more than three thousand six four thousand eight hundred dollars as compensation in any case where such compensation is paid out of any public money appropriated for school purposes. Notice of such employment shall be sent to the retirement board by the employing officials monthly and by the retired teacher at the end of each assignment during the school year.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1971.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To increase amount earned by retired teachers from three thousand six hundred dollars to four thousand eight hundred dollars.
