Mr. Speaker. I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the bill.

SPEAKER VAN NORSTRAND:

The question is on acceptance of the Joint Committee's Favorable Report and passage of the bill. Will you remark?

Yes, I will, Mr. Chairman. This bill is before us as a result of a study committee that we had last year which was public act 85-598. The object of which was to recodify and put into plain language the campaign finance laws, that's chapter 150. And essentially this is what this bill does. It is strictly absolutely only a technical bill. It has been reviewed by law revision by the election enforcement commission, by the Legislators Commissioners Office and everyone else.

And Mr. Speaker, the Clerk has LCO 2915, would the clerk please read and I be allowed to summarize.

Clerk, please call LCO 2915, designated House Amendment Schedule "A".
