On Page 36, Calendar 203, substitute for S.B.
No. 240, AN ACT ELIMINATING THE REQUIREMENT FOR A
FENCE AROUND A SPLASH PAD OR SPRAY PARK; no
amendments.

THE CHAIR:

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Senator Larson.

SENATOR LARSON (3RD):

Good afternoon, Madam President. I move acceptance of the Joint Committee's favorable report and passage of the bill.

THE CHAIR:

Motion is on acceptance and -- and passage. Will you remark, sir?

SENATOR LARSON (3RD):

Yes, Ma'am. This bill would eliminate the requirement of a 4-foot fence around a splash pad or sprinkler, which is currently required by law, as these are considered swimming pools.

Currently in many public parks, the recreational areas, water play that has little or no standing water eliminates needs for lifeguards, et cetera, has little risk of drowning; typically, nozzles coming up from the ground and -- and spraying water. A new way to energize, as well as many municipalities for fountain activity, and so forth.

This passed unanimously out of Committee. I urge adoption.
